### Background

For several years Landmark has worked on the ongoing task of transforming Oldbury Power Station's surroundings into a rich network of wildlife habitats. This work has included designing a nature trail, an important attraction for the Station's busy visitor centre.

### Description

The nature trail directs the walker through a succession of habitats including meadow, wetland, scrub and young woodland. Landmark designed, built and installed interpretative boards for key locations as well as producing a complementary leaflet available from the visitor centre.

Bird hides were erected to allow viewing of the wading birds on the operational silt lagoons and the adjoining Severn Estuary SSSI. Ponds, dipping platforms, an orchard rich in butterflies and birds, and dry, species-rich grass banks all contribute to what has become a varied and well-used resource.

This is just one of many projects which has integrated Landmark's environmental land management and interpretation skills. The practice has designed and built exhibitions and interpretation facilities for many other clients including Zeneca, Bristol Water, the Countryside Council for Wales and English Nature.
